A Letter of Gratitude from Linda Moses, The Pap Corps' President from 2016-2020

Dear Pap Corps Members,

It has truly been an honor and a distinct privilege to have been a part of The Pap Corps leadership team and having ser ved as your Board of Directors' President/Chair these past four years. In my first "Message from the President" in 2016, I wrote that it was with "humility and exhilaration" that I was stepping into the role of President. I was humbled by our legacy and the limitless efforts of our membership and exhilarated by the opportunities to fulfill our Mission of raising funds to support life-saving research programs at



Sylvester. Those feelings have never left me. Much of what follows in this letter would have been shared with you at our May Presidents Meeting had it not been canceled.

The Board of Directors and Board Committee Chairs working with the Chapter leadership have accomplished much during the past four years. Our financial structure is now compliant with current 501(c)(3) practices due in large part to the efforts of our CFO, Stacia Anderson, who is also taking the steps required to prepare for us for the audit process. Our outdated Articles of Incorporation were revised to be in sync with our Bylaws via a successful Proxy Solicitation vote in July 2016—passed by a 99.4% margin of those members who voted (10,342 " Yes" votes and 61 " No" votes). Our operational structure has been reorganized and we are a cohesive and professional organization. We were a participant in Sylvester 's obtaining NCI designation with our September 2016 \$50 million pledge and allocating our donations from that pledge to key areas of research regarded by the NCI as being vital philanthropic de signations for NCI comprehensive cancer centers. As of June 2020, our pledge balance is \$30,719,753. All funds donated to Sylvester by The Pap Corps are applied to our pledge amount.

We are in the final year of our three-year \$200,000 annual amount for **The Pap Corps Champions for Cancer Research Nurses Fund**; the second year of our three-year \$500,000 annual amount for **The Pap Corps Champions for Cancer Research Endowed Chair in Solid Tumor Research**; the sixth consecutive year supporting the Community Foundation of Broward 's **DePICT Trial** (Defining Platforms for Individualized Cancer T reatment) lead by Sylvester 's Jonathan T rent, MD., Ph.D. and for the fourth consecutive year providing \$200,000 (a \$100,000 increase over the matching amount from the Community Foundation); after funding the above yearly programs any remaining amount has been designated to programs in **Tumor Biology**, **Cancer Epigenetics, and Cancer Prevention, Control and Survivorship**. Our **Dr. Kevin Berkowitz Memorial End of Year Giving Initiative** supported Stem Cell Research in 2015; Pancreatic Cancer in 2016; Pediatric Cancer in 2017;

Melanoma in 2018; and the Game Changer Vehicle in 2019. Our partnership with Sylvester has grown to a new level of support and cooperation. The Development Office at Sylvester has both provided information and personnel support when requested as well as initiated exchanges of ideas with us. Sylvester leadership has consistently praised the dedication and efforts of our membership in many public venues and has continued the program of support for members seeking cancer care and treatment.

The success of The Pap Corps is a full team effort. None of this would have been accomplished without the insightful and supportive help of many people—beginning with our **Board of Directors**. They take their responsibilities very seriously, work very hard, and several not only give their time to The Pap Corps Board but are also active in their Chapters. First—and having resigned her position as **Secretary** in May, is **Stavroula Christodoulou**, **Ph.D.** Stavroula has been an oasis of special wisdom with a most insightful know ledge of human behavior. Her advice has been irreplaceable and she has always been available to share it. Thank you, big sister—from little sister.

Susan Dinter, Chair. Susan joined our Board of Directors two years ago. She has served responsibly and diligently as a Director and previously held leadership positions in her Ponte Vecchio Chapter for several years. Since being elected to Vice Chair by the Board, Susan has been working side by side with me for a year in all aspects of the position of Chair, including meetings I have attended with Sylvester leadership. I know and deeply believe that Susan will be an exemplary Chair of The Pap Corps. She is taking over the leadership at a time unknown before in our country's history. All of us are concerned about the future and our leaders need the passion and ability to handle ambiguity at an extraordinary level. Susan is capable of that task. David Beckey, a commercial lender with Seacoast Bank, stepped up as **Treasurer** almost two years ago. His 15 plus years with The Pap Corps Boards, as well as his banking experience, continue to serve us very well. Nancy Levinsohn, one of our more recently elected Directors and the former President of the Addison Reserve Chapter, will succeed Stavroula as Secretary in this most important position of recording the legacy of The Pap Corps for posterity. Beverly Berkowitz is in her second year as Officer-at-Large after serving five years as Vice President focusing on Development. She has lead initiatives such as: our participation in the Dolphins Cancer Challenge (DCC); Footloose and Cancer Free; Garden of Hope bricks and benches; Chapter Fundraising Workshops; End of Year Initiatives; and coaching individual Chapters with their fundraising. Beverly has been the bedrock of The Pap Corps fundraising efforts. Doreen Heisler, Ph.D., an organizational psychologist, is in her second year as an Officer-at-Large governance guru. Governance is not the hottest topic, but a much needed one for nonprofit boards and we have work ed together many long hours commiserating over Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, Board restructuring, etc. Doreen is also the Chair of the Board Nominating Committee . Director Rayna Becker is a passionate voice on our Board sharing

her many years of experience with The Pap Corps. She is also a Co-Chair of the New Chapters Development Committee. **Director Ruth Young** was our Treasurer for four years and her guidance was invaluable during the time of our reorganization. She kept us on a straight path as a CPA and former auditor, but did her magic by showing how we could accomplish certain financial requirements and also fulfil The Pap Corps' specific needs. Our most recently elected **Directors—Elliot Booth** (Co-Chair of The Pap Corps Men's Initiative), **Sharon Goodhart** (Co-Levels of Giving Vice President of The Polo Club Chapter), **Paula Karp** (Past President of the Boca Friends Chapter), **Sharla Manglitz**, and **Melissa Schwartz** have contributed new ideas and are active participants in our Board deliberations.

Our **Board Committee Chairs** provide guidance to the Board of Directors and needed assistance to our Chapter members: **Chapter Physicians Referrals—Barbara Pessel**, Chair, working with Marilyn Ochs, Roberta Oberman, and Jan Waramund; **Chapter Physicians Speaker Requests** --Barbara Pessel, Chair; Development –Beverly Berkowitz, Chair; **Finance and Audit—**David Beckey, Chair; Levels of Giving-- Estelle Heyman, Chair; Membership --Bonnie Lipner, Chair; **New Chapter Development**--Rayna Becker and Bonnie Lipner, Co-Chairs; **Recognition** --Marsha Gold, Chair.

As my concluding comments, I will share something written a few weeks ago in a letter to me from Adam Carlin, Chair of Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center Translational Institute Board of Overseers: "Unparalleled in membership, steadfast in commitment, and tireless in advocacy, there isn't another organization like The Pap Corps. We are humbled and grateful for this unique partnership."

SUPPORTING THE NEXT SURVIVOR

THE JERRY PAULL STORY



Jerry Paull was told he had weeks to live but he was miraculously saved by one of Sylvester's dedicated doctors.

erry Paull, a long-time music promoter and Lifetime Pap Corps Member, was asked to get his affairs in order and say his goodbyes to his wife Karen, other family members, and friends. It was May 2019, and he was losing his battle with acute myeloid leukemia (AML), an aggressive form of blood cancer that almost guarantees death. Jerry was given only a few weeks to live and was ready to let go.

But nearly nine months after his horrific death sentence, he is healthy, happy, and back to a full life. This miraculous recovery from AML was possible because of Dr. Justin Watts at Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center. Dr. Watts was able to help Jerry beat a disease that kills most patients over 60 within a year. He specializes in leukemia and realized that existing therapies, especially in older patients, is ineffective.

For over 40 years, the traditional treatments for AML have been

The first choice to treat this disease is typically chemotherapy, but it usually returns. Other options, such as bone marrow transplants or high-dose chemotherapy, are

type of leukemia diagnosed in adults and children, with most cases occurring in adults. It will affect more than 11,000 people every year, according to The American Cancer Society. The disease has an extremely poor prognosis, especially for patients over 60. It is a rapid-growth blood cancer that start's in the bone marrow and is usually fatal within five years.

Jerry Paul started his battle with cancer at 76 when he was diagnosed with myelodysplastic syndromes (MDS), a litany of bone marrow disorders. As a result, he became weak, exhausted, and susceptible to various other diseases. Eventually, the severity of his symptoms and the constant support needed by his wife caused Jerry and his wife to put their life on hold. His condition worsened, and Jerry returned to the doctor

he met Dr. Justin Watts. Dr. Watts discovered that Jerry had a rare mutation IDH2, and there had recent successes treating this mutation. Jerry aualified for the drug called IDHIFA, which he started taking July

2019. In October 2019, Jerry received fantastic news... he was in full remission!

To this day, Jerry Paull is still in remission. He thanks the innovative doctors at Sylvester and especially The Pap Corps for his remission. The dedicated Members of The PapCorps raise much-needed funds that help Sylvester make miracles happen.




Oncology Nurse Practitioner Fellowship Graduation



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


